

There's no central biblical narrative informing our celebrations.



But this doesn't mean Christians shouldn't pause and reflect on the turning of the calendar. Moses asked of the Lord, "Teach us to number our days, so we may get a heart of wisdom" (Ps. 90:12). Time—seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, months, years—is a gift to us from a good God. To wisely follow him, then, is to redeem our time (Eph. 5:16).

December 15 th, 2024, Council Meeting Minutes

Attendance: Pastor Dana Caldwell, Chad Leonard – Financial Secretary, Beth Leonard & Detailed - Christian Education, Maralyn Saleh – Congregational Giving, Sandy Morris – Clerk There were not enough attendees for a quorum, so we reviewed the following information and approve reports in January.

November 2024 council meeting minutes appeared to be accurate, will approve in January.

Financial Secretary: Chad reported that there is currently about a \$6,000 gap between income and expense, we've been controlling expenses very well this year. \$15,000 went out as donations to local charities, these funds came from the sale of some high yielding stock this year. This report was previously approved by trustees.

Clerk's Report: Sandy reported that there were no changes this month and membership remains at 146

Trustees: The trustees are currently working on replacing lights and fans in the fellowship hall, hoping to have this project completed prior to the Chinese Dinner this winter. They are also have interviews scheduled for the administrative assistant position.

Christian Education: Abby reported that there was a wonderful intergenerational Christmas Program on Dec. 8th. Fire Starters continues to take place on the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays of each month when there is school. Community Youth Group meets once a month with four other churches, rotating who is hosting and events for the students. Amery Breakfast Club continues to take place on the 2nd & 4th Mondays.

Diaconate: Hanging of the Greens went very well on Saturday, November 30 th. Congregational Giving: Maralyn reported that she is excited for new members joining this board in 2025. The wish list brochure is done and will get distributed in the new year.

Mission & Social Concerns: Share the Share for Ruby's Pantry continues to the main focus of this board, this has been very successful so far.

Pastor's Report: Dana shared that the Chinese Dinner planning is well underway, there will be a 5th Sunday potluck on Dec. 29th which we will also celebrate Rae and thank her for her many years of being our administrative assistant. The Wednesday Bible Study will be taking a break for the month of January and will return Tuesday, February 4th at 10am as the Adult Study. Reminder that the church leadership workshop in Saturday, January 4th from 9am-12pm. Dana also asked about the Rummage Sale, we discussed and decided that is will be Saturday, May 31st this year.

Calendar: Remove Bible Study for month of January, and office hours may differ as we will have a gap without an administrative assistant.
